

## Outline of Isaiah

Chapters 1-12: Judgment of the sinful nation of Judah leads to purgation and salvation of the remnant and of all nations in the future Messianic Kingdom

Chapters 13-23: Judgment and Salvation of the Gentile Nations

Chapters 24-27: Isaiah's "Little Apocalypse", revealing events related to the end of the age, the redemption of Israel, the earth's liberation from unjust rulers and Satanic dominion.

Chapters 28-35: further prophecies concerning the judgment of sinful Judah and the future Messianic Kingdom that will follow.

Chapters 36-39: historical section related to Isaiah's role in the reign of Hezekiah

Chapters 40-55: Redemption after exile, with a particular focus on fulfillment of prophecy being proof that Israel's God is the true God (and not the idols of the nations) and on Israel being God's "witness" and "servant", with Israel's role as in this regard finally devolving upon a certain figure who acts as Israel's Messianic Representative (the four "Servant Songs" of Isaiah; 42:1-4; 49:1-8; 50:1-9; 52:13-53:12).

Chapters 56-66: the disenfranchised remnant inherits the future Messianic Kingdom, while the impenitent are judged.
